



A message from our Headteachers

We've been busy reflecting on our term this week, through many trips and exciting opportunities to display our learning. Our curriculum has been designed to provide endless opportunity, endless potential for all of our Warren pupils.

The showcases of learning that parents and carers were invited to this week were examples of how we want Warren pupils to be passionate about the learning. We also want children to feel represented in their learning and as a part of our Warren Community.

Children in Year 3 led an Art exhibition for parents and carers on Thursday afternoon. Children demonstrated their artist flare and their presentation skills, becoming tour guides of the exhibition. They also asked parents and carers to taste test their sandwiches which have been created for their DT project this half term.

In Year 4, children held a showcase of learning about Poland. Children in Year 4 also represented their learning at our church visit on Thursday. They spoke to the school and parents and carers about Polish Easter traditions and shared their learning so confidently!



We are also very excited to share that we will be starting the National School Breakfast Programme in the Summer term.



The programme supports schools in England to provide pupils with a healthy breakfast at the start of the school day. Evidence has shown that pupils benefit from having a healthy, nutritious breakfast each morning to enable them to access learning. We believe that this will support pupils at Warren to have the best start to their day and be ready for their learning.

We will be running the programme with access to Classroom Bagels. This will mean that children will be able to place an order at the start of the term for a bagel and they will then get one every day in the morning for that term. We will be starting this at some point during the first week back after Easter.

It has been a fantastic term and the children are ready for a well-earned break. We look forward to welcoming the children back into school on Monday 17th April.

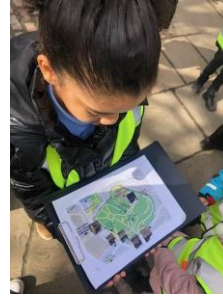

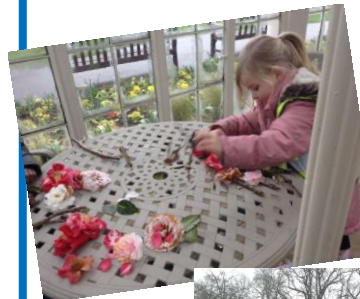

Warren expectations of attendance

<u>Expectation/actions</u>	<u>What you need to know</u>
<p>Absence from school</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We understand your child may not be well enough to attend school. If this is the case, contact MUST be made with school to share why your child is off school. Communication must be made with school on every day of your child's absence. If we do not receive communication from you on each day of your child's absence, school will try all methods possible to ensure contact is made. If it is necessary, a home visit will be completed by members of the Warren team. This is to ensure we know your child is safe.
<p>Absence request forms</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Any other absence from school must be submitted to school via the absence request form. This can be provided for you by the office and it must be completed in a timely manner. School will review the request and decide whether this is classed as an authorised or unauthorised absence. Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Only requests for very exceptional circumstances will be authorised and this will be at the discretion of the Headteacher. The outcome of the request will be communicated with you.
<p>Punctuality and lateness</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The start of the school day is 8.50am. The school gates open daily at 8.30am, with the classroom doors opening from 8.40am. If your child arrives after 8.50am, they will be given a late ticket and they receive a late mark if they arrive after 8.50am. All children being on time for school is very important, as learning in the classroom begins from 8.40am. Our registers close at 9.10am. If your child arrives after this time and it is not for a medical reason, they will be marked with a 'U' code, which means they have an unauthorised absence for that session.
<p>Persistently absent pupils</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your child's attendance drops below 90%, they are classed as being a persistently absent pupil. You will be notified in writing if your child's attendance becomes below 90%. As a school, we have a duty to monitor attendance and we understand that your child's attendance may be lower due to illness. We will track and monitor this over a 4 week period, with the hope that this will improve. You may be asked to attend regular meetings with the school to implement an attendance action plan. If attendance does not improve, the school will refer to the Nottingham City Education Welfare Service. You may receive communication about a fine if attendance does not improve.
<p>Severely absent pupils</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A child is classed as severely absent if attendance is 50% or lower. This can be classed as educational neglect and a referral to social care can be made by the school. The Education Welfare team will be notified, a referral may be completed by the team due to concerns about your child's attendance, and you may be issued with a fine.
<p>Help and support for attendance</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We want to provide help and support to ensure all pupils can access their learning every day. If you are struggling with attendance, or would like further support with any issues around attending school or being on time, please speak to Mrs Salam, Mr Middleton or Mrs Neat, who will be more than happy to help.
