Behaviour update from Mrs Shaw

Mrs Shaw is our Assistant Headteacher and leads on behaviour in our school. A regular update about whole school behaviour will be included on our newsletter from time to time, to inform parents on the positive learning environment in school.

Since the beginning of term, our whole school behaviour system has been updated and the impact of this is being seen across classes by all. Children are focused and ready to learn, showing their engagement in all lessons.

Rewards and consequences

Rewards for positive behaviour at Warren include raffle tickets with a weekly draws in each class to win a prize, teamwork treasures, lead learners' code stamps and celebrations in our weekly Friday assembly.

Each class also has a visual system to show children being ready to learn. This is also used as a visual reminder for children who may need to consider better choices in lowlevel behaviours.

Break and dinner times

At break times, children are able to earn a whole class rewards through a 'yard card'. The class work together to ready for their learning at the end of break times and are rewarded for positively demonstrating this.

Lunchtimes have also been very positive since the start of term. An introduction of focused zones, where different activities are led each day, has supported good team working skills, and collaboration between children in different classes. From next week, children who have applied to become Play Leaders, will also be leading games in the playground at lunch time.



Food hampers

We have partnered with charity Himmah, who are providing school with food parcels on a weekly basis. We are able to give food parcels out to families at school who are in need of them. RAF STEM coding day for Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6

Children in Year 4, 5 and 6 were visited by the Royal Air Force and Hyett Education today. Warren were one of only fifteen schools to have been given this opportunity across the East Midlands. The children have worked in teams to build their own robot, and then used iPads to create their own codes to programme the robot to move around a course. All of the children showed fantastic team working skills, collaboration and creative ability in their session. A huge thank you to the team at Hyett Education for such an engaging and exciting experience.
