We are also very lucky to have our own school Family Support Worker, Mrs Neat. Mrs Neat works in school on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays and is available to support families with accessing services across the city and county. We are also working to create new relationships with charities and businesses in Nottingham too. We have food parcels from charity Himmah, being delivered to school on Monday, for any families who are in need. #### **Parents evening**



Parents evening is being held <u>in the school hall</u> on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> October. Teachers from Y1-Y6 will be based in the hall and will be available to speak to you at the time that has been allocated to you.
