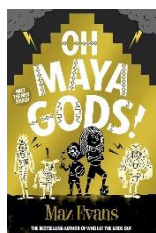

An Overview of the Theme

This half-term, our theme in Year 6 will be learning about the ancient civilisation of The Mayans and we will be working up to answering our enquiry question:

How did Mayan life compare to ours today?

English



Our class text this half term is Oh Maya Gods by Maz Evans. Whilst reading this book your child will:

- Write an adventure narrative
- Write a diary entry
- Write a non-chronological report

We will also be spending time continuing our development of the understanding of spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) as we work towards our SATs tests in May.

Mathematics

Your child will be learning about fractions and measure (Imperial and Metric)

Fractions-

- use common factors to simplify fractions; use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination
- compare and order fractions, including fractions >1
- add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions
- multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form
- divide proper fractions by whole numbers
- associate a fraction with division and calculate decimal fraction equivalents for a simple fraction
- identify the value of each digit in numbers given to three decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000 giving answers up to three decimal places
- multiply one-digit numbers with up to 2 decimal places by whole numbers
- use written division methods in cases where the answer has up to 2 decimal places
- solve problems which require answers to be rounded to specified degrees of accuracy

Measure-

- solve problems involving the calculation and conversion of units of measure, using decimal notation up to 2 decimal places where appropriate
- use, read, write and convert between standard units, converting measurements of length, mass, volume and time from a smaller unit of measure to a larger unit, and vice versa.
- convert between miles and kilometres
