I really enjoyed this book and then went on to read 'Ellie and the Cat, by Malorie Blackman.

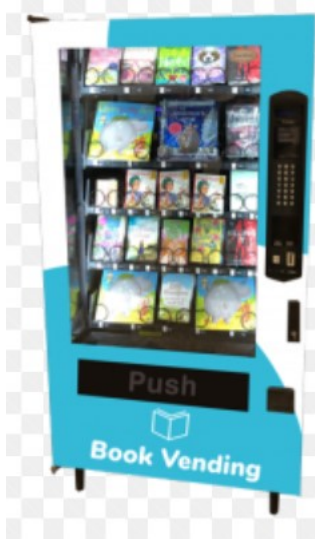
Miss Pithers was so kind to find me this book and it was something I had never seen before!

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Reading vending machine!



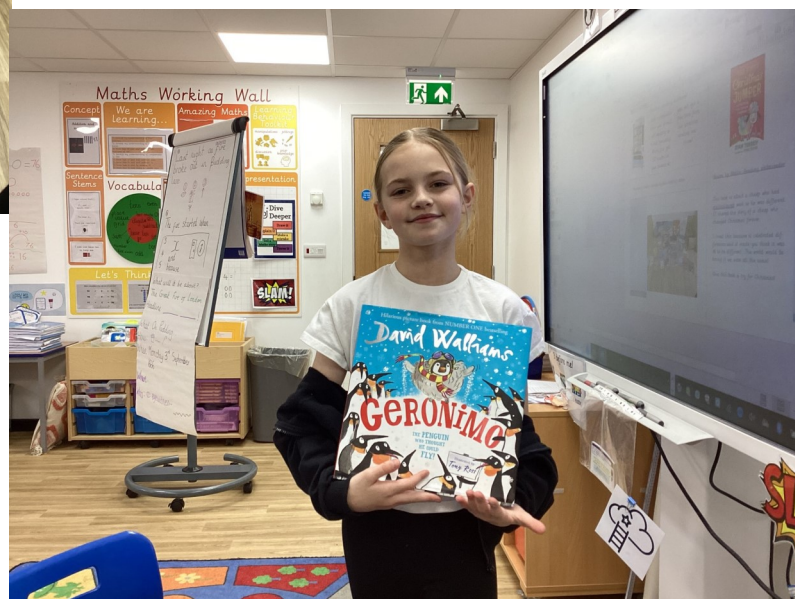

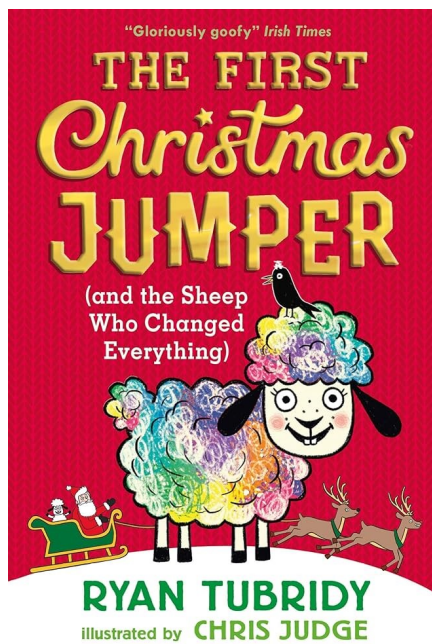

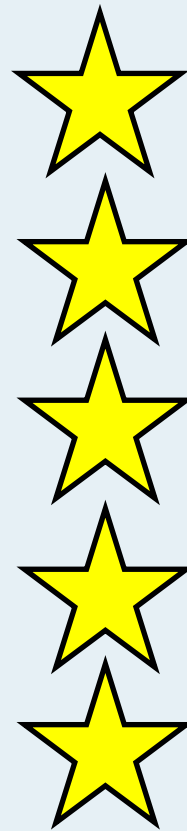


Review by Mollie, Reading ambassador

I loved this because it celebrated differences and it made you think it was ok to be different. The world would be boring if we were all the same!

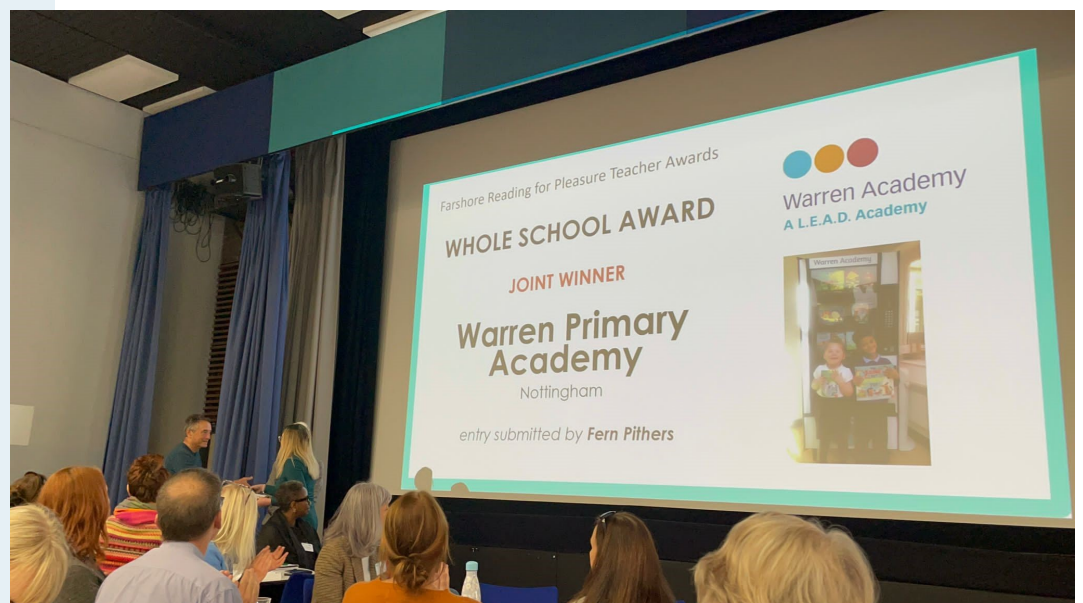
