Please find information below about what your child will be learning about in each subject area over the next half term.


Curriculum theme for this half term

Reading - Books we will be reading this half term







Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)



In PSED this half term we will continue to work on our executive function skills by learning to:

- · show responsibility for our own feelings
- · see a task to the end
- · join in with our friends in playing games

Communication and Language (CAL)



In Communication and Language this half term we will be learning to:

- · remember the main events in a story
- · follow simple instructions
- · use fantasy language in play

Physical Development (PD)



In Physical Development this half term we will be leaning to:

- show greater control when making movements, such as changing direction when running (gross motor skills)
- show finer control with smaller tools such as scissors (fine motor skills)

Literacy



In Literacy this half term we will be learning to:

- talk about characters in a story
- make shapes that are recognisable pre-letter shapes
- write our name as a shape
- explore and create sound words and clap syllables in words

Mathematics + - × =	In Maths this half term we will be learning to: · count up to five · identify when 2 groups have the same number · start to use simple shape names
Understanding the World (UW)	 In Understanding the World we will be leaning to: talk about similarities and differences between past and present recognise simple features like tree, river, beach recognise places of worship that might be important to them or others, for example churches or mosques
Expressive Arts and Design. (EAD)	In Expressive Arts and Design we will be learning to: show more control when expressing ourselves more deliberate use of materials, colour and changes
