**Challenge 1:**

Listen to the story of Nigel's numberless world. Can you see the numbers all around? Can you go around your house and find numbers? Can you take photos and send them to your teachers? If you cannot log in to view the video on teams, still complete the task but email the photos to your class teacher instead.

**Challenge 2:**

Can you use 10 in the whole and find all the different addition sentences you can make with 10 as an answer? Eg  $1 + 9 = 10$  If you would like some help, there is a video you can watch on Teams. Can you write them in your book? Can you see a pattern? Can you use 20 and find the addition sentences?

**Challenge 3:**

Can you count out 10 objects (pasta, pegs etc) from around the house? Can you share 10 with your adult? Are there any left over? Now try 9? Repeat with numbers to 1. Which numbers can be shared equally? Which can't?

**Challenge 1:**

Please watch the video of the Ninjabread man. The Ninja animals in the story all have special skills. These are speedy, sneaky and brave. Choose your own animal and create your own Ninjabread character? What would your special skill be? Can you draw a picture and write a sentence about it? e.g. I am a Ninja cat. I can jump really high.

**Challenge 2:**

Listen to the Ninjabread Man. Tell your grown up about it. Did you enjoy this story? What did you like or dislike about it? Does this story remind you of another story you know? What is the same and different about these stories? Do you know any other stories with Ninja's in? It would be lovely to see a video of you telling us what you liked about the story.

**Challenge 3:**

The story of the Ninjabread Man ends with the Ninjabread Man running away over the hills. What do you think will happen next? Write a story about the Ninjabread Man's next adventure.

**Challenge 1:**

**Challenge 2:**

The NinjaBread Man is very good at getting past the other Ninja's by being speedy, sneaky and brave. What are you really good at? What would you like to get better at? Draw a picture and write a sentence about what you are really good at and then a skill that you would like to get better at.



**Challenge 3:**

Make your own Ninjabread Man. You can use the one attached. Decorate it to look like a Ninja too.



Make your own gingerbread man with this recipe!

350g plain flour, 100g butter, 2 teaspoons ground ginger, 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon, 1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, 175g light brown soft sugar, 4 tablespoons golden syrup, 1 large egg.

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C / Gas 4.
2. Chop the butter into small pieces and add to a bowl with the flour, ginger, cinnamon and bicarbonate of soda and mix until crumbly. Add the sugar, syrup and egg, mix until it forms a firm dough.
3. Dust the surface and a rolling pin with flour. Roll out the dough to about 5mm thick.
4. Now, cut out your gingerbread people.
5. Put the shapes on greaseproof paper on a baking tray.
6. Bake until golden, about 12 minutes. If using a fan oven, about 10 minutes.
