


**Maths activities**

**Challenge 1:**

Draw shapes on some chopped up pieces of paper.  
Can you play snap with your grown-up?  
When the shapes are the same shout snap! If you're correct and first you win the cards, don't forget to name the shape too.

**Challenge 2:**

You will need up to 20 objects today.  
Roll the dice to see how many objects should be in each group (you will need two groups).  
Can you add the two groups together?  
How many objects altogether?  
Can you write a number sentence to show that?



**Challenge 3:**

Can you find two dice and play a game with your grown-ups. Each take turns rolling the dice and find who has the most. If you have the most you get 1 point.

Have five turns each and the winner is the person who gets the most points. Remember to count the dice carefully.



**Reading activities**

**Challenge 1:**

Look at a picture in one of your story books, can you ask some questions about the picture using these question words?

- What?**
- Where?**
- When?**
- Who?**

**Challenge 2:**

Can you use your robot arms to sound out these words using the sounds that we have learnt? Ask your grown up to write these words in big letters so that you can sound them out. Can you blend them together to say the word?

**Challenge 3:**

Can you find another story with animals in?  
Are there any animals the same as Room on the Broom? Do you enjoy listening and reading stories with animals in?  
Do you have a favourite?  
Why?

**Writing activities**

**Challenge 1:**

Help your grown-up to make your lunch (sandwich etc.)  
Can you write instructions for how to make your lunch?  
Don't forget lots of pictures too!

**Challenge 2:**

Watch the video of the story "Room on the Broom"

In the story, there are lots of words that sound the same like **cat** and **hat** or **be** and **me**. Can you have a go at saying some words that sound the same or even having a go at writing some words? You can see how many words sound the same like cat, sat, bat can you think of any more?

**Challenge 3:**

Can you make stick puppets to retell your own version of Room on the Broom?



Use lolly sticks or straws and draw your characters and cut them out to stick on.

**Weekly learning challenge – Make it (these challenges all use recycling boxes, pots and lids)**

**Challenge 1:**

Can you make an animal that lives in the ocean?  
I'd love to see some pictures of your creations!



**Challenge 2:**

Can you make your own pompoms and then create a dance routine to use them in?  
You could use tissue paper and toilet roll tubes.



**Challenge 3:**

Use an old egg box to create an under the sea scene, you could paint it blue and add tissue paper seaweed and even some shells. Don't forget to add the sea creatures!
