

Maths activities**Challenge 1:**

Can you use a tape measure or a ruler to measure things around your house or garden?

How long are they?

Which object was the longest?

Which object was the shortest?

What can you find that is longer/shorter than your arm/foot?

Challenge 2:

Can you make a repeating pattern with objects you can find in your garden such as twigs, leaves, petals, flowers and pebbles?

e.g. leaf, pebble, leaf, pebble

e.g. leaf, pebble, flower, leaf, pebble, flower

Can you tell your adult what the pattern is?

Challenge 3:

Can you gather 5 different toys and put them in order from biggest to smallest?

Choose another 5 toys and order them from shortest to tallest.

Reading activities**Challenge 1:**

What is your favourite traditional tale? (3 little pigs, Little Red Riding Hood, Goldilocks and the three bears).

Draw the characters, cut them out, and turn them into stick puppets.

Put on your own puppet show of the story.

Challenge 2:

Share a book with a grown up. Talk to them about the people (characters) in the story.

Which characters were good? What did they do to be good?

Which characters were bad? What did they do to be bad?

Challenge 3:

Go on a letters and sound hunt in your book or around your house.

Can you find these letters?

Can you tell your grown up what sound they make?

Writing activities**Challenge 1:**

Can you draw a picture of a keyworker who helps us? (nurse, doctor, fireman, policeman, teacher, postman, shop worker etc.)

Can you tell your grown up why they are important?

For an extra challenge have a go at labelling what they are wearing.

Challenge 2:

Can you write a shopping list for your grown up for when they go shopping?

You might want to draw the item next to your words.

Challenge 3:

Look out of your window, what can you see?

Can you draw everything you can see?

Can you tell your grownup what you have drawn?

Weekly learning challenge – Make it

Can you make your own instrument? You could use empty cereal boxes or juice/milk cartons.

You could put some dry rice, pasta or lentils inside to make a shaker!



Can you make your own Robbie Robot to help you with your robot talking?

You can use empty boxes, yoghurts pots and lots more things!

Don't forget to make him colourful and shiny!



Can you make a picture using flowers (daisy/dandelion) from the garden?
