How will we know if your child has an additional need?

If your child had Special Educational Need or Disability (SEND) we will identify them through observations, tracking of your child's progress, support from external services or through a clinical diagnosis (GP/Paediatrician). This will be done in collaboration with parents/carers via regular meetings/phone calls.

Once we have monitored progress and discussed strategies to support your child, we can contact the relevant expertise services with parent/carer permission. These agencies may come and observe the child and recommended strategies to support them further. Such agencies include: behaviour support, autism team, learning support team etc.

How we support children with SEND at Warren Academy Warren Academy

What support do we give pupils in the classroom?

Every teacher makes reasonable adjustments with the quality first teaching they provide. Adjustments such as differentiated planning/work, alternative resources and modelling. Pupils may be supported by an Individual Provision Map (IPM) which outlines their specific learning requirements and teaching and learning strategies which support them to ensure that progress is made and that small realistic targets are achieved. If required, additional support can be provided through intervention groups or targeted work with a smaller group of children.

We also work in partnership with external agencies to review and adapt our environment and curriculum to best support the needs of all our pupils.

How do we know if your child is making progress towards their targets:

Every pupil's progress is continuously monitored by their class teacher; IPM targets and provision is reviewed and adapted when required or at least every half term. This information is shared by the class teacher to the Executive Head or Head of School in termly pupil progress meetings and adjustments are made to the pupil's provision as required.

Class teachers will review your Child's IPM targets with you during both parents evening and these can be discussed along with your child's progress.

The class teacher will speak to the child about what their targets are and how we will support them to achieve them (where appropriate).

EHCP's:

Parent/carers can request an Education, Health and Care (EHC) assessment. School will support parents with this process.
