Developing a love of reading

Miss Pithers, our English lead, has been working hard on our English curriculum over the last half term. She has a passion for reading for pleasure and sharing new books with the children. Here are some updates from her about what has been going on with our reading curriculum!

We have lots of exciting things happening with reading across school. There has been significant work completed in our library, and the children are now able to access a book they can read for enjoyment and pleasure, in addition to their levelled reading book.

There is a new reading team in school, who are responsible for all things reading! This week, they have been writing book reviews, as well as creating ideas for different themes in the library across the year. We will also be choosing the Vending Machine design winner, and the machine itself will be installed in the library very soon! This will be used for rewards for reading at home so please continue to read with your children as much as you can!

The Bookmark Charity have donated brand new books to us, which are worth over £2000! These will be put into book corners in class rooms, as well as in the library too.

We have worked hard across the staff team to link books to our new topics too.

Children will be reading texts in lessons that are linked to their Geography and History learning. This is to empower children to have more knowledge and find a love of books they may not have had before!

We have been fortunate to welcome a number of new reading volunteers into school. These are members of our local community, who are giving up their time to listen to children read. We are very grateful for all their help!

Book swap is continuing to run, and will be held in the hall on Tuesday 15th after school. Please bring back books that have been borrowed and take some new ones read!

There is lots happening in school over the next few weeks, so we ask you to keep as up-to-date as possible with the newsletter and updates on Classdojo/text messages.

- Thursday 15th Dec at 2pm



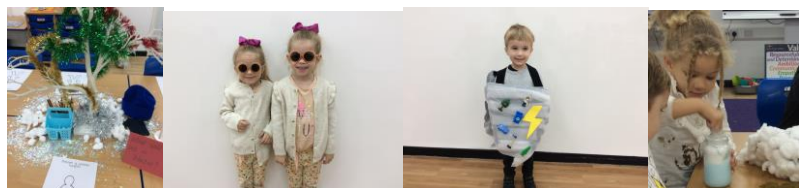
Due to space, we are only able to allocate 2 tickets per child. More information about getting tickets will be shared soon.
