Welcome back & our curriculum

The children have had a brilliant first week back at school following the half term break! Children in Early Years, Y1 and Y2 have started new topics this term, learning about areas such as Celebrations and Festivals, Weather and Seasons, and The Great Fire of London. In KS2, children are continuing with their topic learning from Autumn 1 this half term.

We have been working hard across school on our curriculum and have made some changes to reflect our school community, as well as support all children to feel they are represented in their learning. Our Geography and History topics now include more diverse studies, including developing understanding of the Caribbean and Poland. Our aim is to ensure all children feel included in their learning and that other pupils are able to learn about different countries and cultures.

The children will also be experiencing a 'hook' in their learning at the start of each new topic they learn. Your child's teacher will communicate this to you when they are starting a new learning journey! To demonstrate learning that has taken place, each class will also produce an authentic outcome to show their new knowledge and skills. This will include inviting parents in to showcase learning, or create digital content which can be shared with our community. Very exciting indeed!

Trips have also been carefully planned to link to topic areas across the year.

Curriculum overviews and a newsletter will be shared with all parents and carers on Monday, so you can see what your child is learning about this half term. It is also a great opportunity to talk to your child about their learning and support them with it at home. We would love to hear about how they are being Historians, Scientists or Geographers outside of school!

F2: Jaxon for showing ambition through excellent learning behaviour & Cohen for being determined to perform his best.





In order to make the process for applying for the clubs as efficient as possible, we will be trialling an online application process. This will go live via Class Dojo on next week.


Each club will have a limited number of spaces, and will be allocated on a first come, first serve basis. We will then have a waiting list for children if spaces become free.
