Expectation/actions	What you need to know		
Absence from school	 We understand your child may not be well enough to attend school. If this is the case, contact <u>MUST</u> be made with school to share why your child is off school. 		
	Communication must be made with school on every day of your child's absence.		
	If we do not receive communication from you on each day of your child's absence, school will		
	try all methods possible to ensure contact is made.		
	• If it is necessary, a home visit will be completed by members of the Warren team. This is to		
	ensure we know your child is safe.		
Absence request forms	Any other absence from school must be submitted to school via the absence request form. This		
	can provided for you by the office and it must be completed in a timely manner.		
	School will review the request and decide whether this is classed as an authorised or		
	unauthorised absence.		
	 Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Only requests for very exceptional circumstances will be authorised and this will be at the discretion of the Headteacher.
