A message from our Headteachers

Welcome back to the start of the final term this academic year! It is a busy term, so please keep reading communication we send out to you over the coming weeks! We want the community to be involved in the exciting things we have planned to finish the year!

A reminder about attendance

Your child's attendance to school on a daily basis is key for them to have the best possible chances in life. Our overall school attendance to date is 92% and we are aware that there has been some illness occurring in classes in the lower year groups of school.

As we go into Summer 2, we ask that you:

- Call every day to notify us why your child is absent from school.
- Talk to us if there is an issue in getting your child to school – we may be able to support you.
- Ensure your child has arrived by 8.50am <u>at the latest</u>
 this is the time the gate closes.

We also wanted to remind parents and carers that we are not able to authorise holidays that are taken during term-time. This forms a part of our Trust attendance policy. If you have any questions or would like to discuss your child's attendance further, please speak to Mrs Neat – our Family Support Worker.

Our after school club offer was posted onto Class Dojo earlier this week, and parents/carers who have signed their child up for a new club will hear about these by the end of the day on Friday.


Girls' Football Club will run as a one off on Tuesday next week, due to Mr Eddyshaw not being in school on Monday.

Absence from school	 We understand your child may not be well enough to attend school. If this is the case, contact <u>MUST</u> be made with school to share why your child is off school.

Absence request forms	Any other absence from school must be submitted to school via the absence request form. This			
	can provided for you by the office and it must be completed in a timely manner.

	 Holidays during term time will not be authorised. Only requests for very exceptional circumstances will be authorised and this will be at the discretion of the Headteacher.
