A message from our Headteachers

We wanted to start by saying thank you to parents and carers for the efforts that you have demonstrated to support us in improving attendance over the last week. As we move into colder and wetter months, please continue to bring your child to school – we want all pupils to achieve our school vision and they can only do this if they are in attendance of school every day!

We will always be happy to help if you are unsure if your child is able to attend school, so please contact the school office or speak with Mrs Neat for any further support.

We have also been reviewing our curriculum offer in school over the last week. Your child will be invited to join the class on a trip, visit or to welcome a visitor into school, which is linked to their learning, every term. The children will also create an 'authentic outcome' every term which will be shared with an audience to demonstrate their learning.

Keep your eye out for communication on when these things will be taking place!

We are supporting the children in understanding how to use technology to support their learning across school. We now have a class set of iPads which are being used from Year 1-Year 6 in creative ways.

Your child may have told your about a new app we are using in school called Showbie.



The app will be being used in school as a learning portfolio across all subjects in the curriculum. The app can also be accessed for free at home, and can be used to send learning to the class teacher, as well as seeing the learning being completed in the classroom! Your child's log in will be shared with you over the coming weeks to give you an opportunity to explore the app with your child at home.

HOME-START NOTTINGHAM ARE RECRUITING FOR HOME VISITING VOLUNTEERS


Home-Start volunteers support families with young children aged between 0-8 years old with individual one-to-one home visiting.


Home-Start's volunteers work alongside families to give compassionate and confidential support, tailored to each family
