


An Overview of the Theme

This half-term, our theme in Year 6 is World War 2 where we will be working up to answering our enquiry question:

How did people in Britain survive World War 2?

English



Our class text this half term is Letters From the Lighthouse by Emma Carroll. Whilst reading this book your child will:

- Write a setting description based on the short film 'Beyond the Lines'
 - Focussing on figurative language
- Write an newspaper report detailing events of World War 2
 - Focusing on formal language and a range of clause structures
- Write an explanation text
- Write a war poem based on our learning about World War 2.

Mathematics

Your child will be learning about place value and the four operations Number and Place Value

- read, write, order and compare numbers up to 10,000,000 and determine the value of each digit
- round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy
- use negative numbers in context, and calculate intervals across 0
- solve number and practical problems that involve all of the above

Number- Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division

- multiply multi-digit numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the formal written method of long multiplication
- divide numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the formal written method of long division, and interpret remainders as whole number remainders, fractions, or by rounding, as appropriate for the context.

<u>Reminders</u>
