A quantity surveyor is someone who keeps track of the cost of building projects. To be a quantity surveyor, you need to enjoy working outdoors and also like problem solving. You will work to help plan building projects and ensure that finances and money are spent wisely and that the project stays within budget.

You will need to have GCSEs in English, Maths and Science, as well as A-level qualifications.

Routes into the industry: You will need to study at university, for a degree to become a quantity surveyor. You may work as an apprentice quantity surveyor whilst you are completing your training.
